Change Order No. 1 (Final)

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

The Oakland Court Improvements Project was recently completed. The original contract amount with Salenbien Trucking and Excavating, Inc. on the project was \$417,305.75 and received Council approval on February 5, 2024 by Ordinance 9-2024. Now that the project is completed, the final installed quantities have been resolved and a change order is necessary to adjust the final contract price.

The installed quantities have resulted in a decrease to the original contract in the amount of \$25,616.99. The largest savings items to the project were related to the condition of the subgrade. The condition of the subgrade was in good shape and allowed the City to save just under \$16,000 by not having to remove poor material and replace it with premium backfill. Enclosed is the complete list of all quantity overruns and underruns on the project.

A total change order in the amount of \$25,616.99 is necessary to decrease the final contract amount from \$417,305.75 to \$391,688.76. Please call if you have any questions.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 129-2024**

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO APPROVE CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 (FINAL) TO THIS CITY'S AGREEMENT WITH SALENBIEN TRUCKING AND EXCAVATING, INC. FOR THE OAKLAND COURT IMPROVEMENT PROJECT; DECREASING THE CONTRACT AMOUNT BY \$25,616.99; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 9-2024, passed February 5, 2024, accepted the bid of Salenbien Trucking and Excavating, Inc. and awarded the contract for the Oakland Court Improvements Project to same, which bid was in the amount of \$417,305.75; and,

WHEREAS, the project is now complete and a change order is necessary to adjust the final contract price based on the installed quantities; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated September 16, 2024, has recommended acceptance of Change Order No. 1 (Final) of Helms and Sons Excavating, Inc. for said Oakland Court Improvements Project to reflect a reduction in the installed quantities in the amount of \$25,616.99, for a final contract amount of \$391,688.76; and,

WHEREAS, the final installed quantities resulted in a net decrease to the contract in the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand Six Hundred Sixteen and 99/100 Dollars (\$25,616.99), for a total contract amount of \$391,688.76.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, \_\_\_\_ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That said change order decreasing the contract amount by the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Six Hundred Sixteen and 99/100 Dollars (\$25,616.99) be, and the same hereby is, approved, and the Mayor and the Director of Finance be, and they hereby are, authorized to sign said change order on behalf of this City, thereby indicating such approval and changing the total contract amount.

SECTION 2. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the adjustments in the contract for said actual work should be approved immediately. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

SECTION 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

#### 945.02 HOURS; RULES AND REGULATIONS.

All such parks shall be open to the public for use from sunrise to sunset. Rules and regulations, not inconsistent with this chapter, shall be promulgated from time to time by the Director of Public Safety as to all aspects of the use of such parks, with power to enforce all ordinances, rules and regulations relating to the same and as shall be promulgated by the Director of Public Safety as to all aspects of the use of such parks. The Director of Public Service shall promulgate all rules and regulations relating to all aspects of improvements to such parks such as paving, sidewalks, sewers and water lines, which rules and regulations shall, before they become effective, be approved by the Mayor in writing endorsed on such rules and regulations and also be published by posting the same as provided for the publication of municipal ordinances.

## 945.07 REMOVAL OR DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY AND NATURAL FEATURES.

- (a) No person in a park shall remove any property, natural feature or part thereof including, but not limited to, any building, equipment, sign, rock, stone, mineral formation, earth, wood, tree, shrub, flower, and/or plant from a park without a permit from the Mayor or designee.
- (b) No person in a park shall injure, destroy, break, cut, chop, write upon, mutilate, set fire to, deface, dig, paint or damage in any manner any property, natural feature or part thereof, including but not limited to, any building, equipment, sign, rock, stone, mineral formation, earth, wood, tree, shrub, flower or plant.

- (c) No person in a park shall build a fire at a time or period when the Mayor or designee has prohibited the building of fires.

  - (2) Any street; or
  - (3) Any public property, improved or unimproved.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 89-2007, passed October 1, 2007, authorized the Mayor and Director of Finance to enter into an Agreement with the Board of Lucas County Commissioners for after hours animal control services by the dog warden of Lucas County, Ohio; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 5-2011, passed February 7, 2011, authorized the Mayor and Director of Finance to enter into an Agreement with the Board of Lucas County Commissioners for after hours animal control services by the dog warden of Lucas County; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 88 -2013, passed December 2, 2013, authorized the Mayor and Director of Finance to enter into an Agreement with the Board of Lucas County

Commissioners for after hours canine control services for the years 2014, 2015 and 2016; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 73-2016, passed November 21, 2016, authorized the Mayor and Director of Finance to enter into an Agreement with the Board of Lucas County

Commissioners for after hours canine control services for the years 2017 and 2018; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 65-2018, passed December 3, 2018, authorized the Mayor and Director of Finance to enter into an Agreement with the Board of Lucas County

Commissioners for after hours canine control services for the years 2019, 2020 and 2021; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 69-2021, passed October 4, 2021, authorized the Mayor and Director of Finance to enter into an Agreement with the Board of Lucas County Commissioners

for after hours canine control services for the years 2022, 2023 and 2024; and,

WHEREAS, the City's Agreement with the Board of County Commissioners of Lucas County, Ohio, expires on December 31, 2024 and the Commissioners have proposed a new agreement for a one-year term and no increase in the cost of this service; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Safety has recommended this Agreement be approved; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has been providing after hours animal control services by the dog warden to this City at an annual cost of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) to cover the base cost of operating the service plus an amount based upon four hours of overtime pay for the Canine Care Officer at the prevailing rate of pay including actual extra cost to the County for fringe benefits created by the overtime service; and,

WHEREAS, this Council desires to have animal control services around the clock.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, \_\_\_\_ members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they hereby are authorized to enter into an agreement with the Board of County Commissioners for after hours animal control services of the dog warden providing for a payment to Lucas County in the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for the year 2025.

SECTION 2. That all charges under the agreement entered into with the Board of County Commissioners of Lucas County, Ohio, for animal control services of the dog warden shall be charged to and paid from **Account No. 110-7110-52268 - Miscellaneous Law Enforcement**.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal

requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 5. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that twenty-four (24) hour per day animal control services should be authorized to be continued at the earliest possible time, and therefore, this Ordinance should be effective immediately. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 132-2024**

REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 127-2024; DECLARING THE IMPROVEMENT TO CERTAIN PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY TO BE A PUBLIC PURPOSE AND EXEMPT FROM TAXATION AND PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND DEPOSIT OF SERVICE **PAYMENTS** INTO THE TAX **EQUIVALENT** FUND, AND **SPECIFYING** THE **PUBLIC** INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS DIRECTLY BENEFITING THE PARCELS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Sections 5709.40 to 5709.43 (collectively, the "TIF Statutes") authorize the legislative authority of a municipal corporation to declare the improvements to parcels of real property located within the municipal corporation to be a public purpose and exempt from taxation, specify public infrastructure improvements made, to be made or in the process of being made that directly benefit, require the owner of each parcel to make service payments in lieu of taxes, and establish a municipal public improvement tax increment equivalent fund for the deposit of the those service payments; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Sylvania has developed a plan for improving the infrastructure s and laying the basis for future growth and development by incurring debt for new public infrastructure in the area identified in Exhibit A; and,

WHEREAS, the parcels of real property identified and depicted in Exhibit A attached hereto (each such parcel individually, the "Parcel") are located in the City of Sylvania, Ohio (collectively, the "Property"), and this Council has determined to declare the Improvements to the Property to be a public purpose; and,

WHEREAS, this Council desires to provide for the public infrastructure improvements described in Exhibit B attached hereto (the "Public Infrastructure Improvements'); and,

WHEREAS, notice of this Ordinance has been delivered to the Sylvania City School District ("School District") pursuant to the requirements of Ohio Revised Code Sections 5709.40 and 5709.83, with the School District adopted a resolution waiving the notification period and approving the exemptions in excess of the statutory rate and term limits, as long as the school district receives Service Payments as directed in Section 4.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, County of Lucas, State of Ohio, \_\_\_\_\_ members thereto elected concurring that:

SECTION 1. Authorization of Tax Exemption. Pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 5709.40 of the Ohio Revised Code, this Council hereby finds and determines that one-hundred percent (100%) of the increase in assessed value of the parcels in the Property subsequent to the effective date of this Ordinance (which increase in assessed value is hereinafter referred to as the "Improvement," as defined in Section 5709.40(B) of the Ohio Revised Code) is hereby declared to be a public purpose and shall be exempt from taxation for a period commencing, for each Parcel comprising the Property, with the first tax year that begins after the effective date of this Ordinance and in which an Improvement attributable to a new structure first appears on the tax list and duplicate of real and public utility property for said Parcel, and ending on the earlier of (a) thirty (30) years after such commencement for said Parcel, or (b) the date on which the City can no longer require service payments in lieu of taxes for said Parcel, all in accordance with the requirements of the TIF Statutes. Pursuant to Section 5709.40(G) of the Ohio Revised Code, it is expressly the intent of this Ordinance that the exemptions of Improvements to Parcels authorized herein may commence in different tax years on a Parcel-by-Parcel basis, with a separate exemption term for each.

SECTION 2. Service Payments and Property Tax Rollback Payments. Pursuant to Section 5709.42 of the Ohio Revised Code, this Council hereby directs and requires the Owner(s) of the Property to make annual Service Payments (as defined herein) in lieu of taxes with respect to the Improvement allowable thereto to the Lucas County Treasurer on or before the final dates for payment of real property taxes. Each service payment in lieu of taxes, including any penalties and interest at the then-current rate established under Sections 323.121(B)(1) and 5703.47 of the Ohio Revised Code (collectively, the "Service Payments"), shall be charged and collected in the same manner and in the same amount as the real property taxes that would have been charged and payable against the Improvement if it were not exempt from taxation pursuant to Section 1 of this Ordinance. The Service Payments, and any other payments with respect to the Improvement that are received by the Lucas County Treasurer in connection with the reduction required by Sections 319.302, 321.24, 323.152, and 323.156 of the Ohio Revised Code, as the same may be amended from time to time, or any successor provisions thereto as the same may be amended from time to time (the "Property Tax Rollback Payments"), shall be allocated and distributed in accordance with Section 4 of this Ordinance. This Council further hereby authorizes and directs appropriate officers of the City to make such arrangements as are necessary and proper for collection of the Service Payments from the Owners, including the preparation and filing of any necessary exemption applications.

SECTION 3. Tax Increment Equivalent Fund. This Council hereby establishes, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 5709.43 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Sylvania Public Improvement Tax Increment Equivalent Fund (the "TIF Fund"). The TIF Fund shall be maintained in the

custody of the City and shall receive all distributions to be made to the City pursuant to Section 2 of this Ordinance. Those Service Payments and Property Tax Rollback Payments received by the City with respect to the Improvement of the Property and so deposited pursuant to Section 5709.42 of the Ohio Revised Code shall be used solely for the purposes authorized in the TIF Statutes or this Ordinance. The TIF Fund shall remain in existence so long as such Service Payments and Property Tax Rollback Payments are collected and used for the aforesaid purposes, after which time the TIF Fund shall be dissolved and any surplus funds remaining therein transferred to the City's General Fund, all in accordance with Section 5709.43 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- SECTION 4. Distribution of Funds. Pursuant to the TIF Statutes, the Lucas County Treasurer is requested to distribute the Service Payments and the Property Tax Rollback Payments as follows:
- (i) To the School District: an amount equal to the amounts the School District would otherwise have received as real property tax payments (including the applicable portion of any Property Tax Rollback Payments) derived from the Improvement to the Property located within the School District's boundaries if the Improvement had not been exempt from taxation pursuant to this Ordinance; and
- (ii) To the City: All remaining amounts for further deposit in the TIF Fund for payment of costs of the Public Infrastructure Improvements, including debt service on any securities issued to finance those costs.
- SECTION 5. Public Infrastructure Improvements. This Council hereby designates the Public Infrastructure Improvements described in Exhibit B attached hereto, and any other public infrastructure improvements hereafter designated by ordinance as public infrastructure improvements, as public infrastructure improvements made, to be made or constructed, or in the process of being made or constructed, by the City or other entity approved by the City that directly benefit, or that once made will benefit, the Property.
- SECTION 6. Non-Discriminatory Hiring Policy. In accordance with Section 5709.832 of the Ohio Revised Code, this Council hereby determines that no employer located upon the Property shall deny any individual employment based solely on the basis of race, religion, sex, disability, color, national origin, or ancestry.
- SECTION 7. Further Authorizations. This Council hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor, Economic Development Director, Finance Director, Law Director, and other appropriate officers of the City to make such arrangements as are necessary and proper for collection of the Service Payments. This Council further authorizes the Mayor, Development Director, Finance Director, Law Director, and other appropriate officers of the City to prepare and sign all agreements and instruments and to take any other actions as may be appropriate to implement this Ordinance.
- SECTION 8. Filings with the Ohio Department of Development. Pursuant to Section 5709.40(I) of the Ohio Revised Code, the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to deliver a copy of this Ordinance to the Director of Development Services for the State of Ohio within fifteen (15) days after its adoption. Further, on or before March 31 of each year that the exemption set forth in Section 1 of this Ordinance remains in effect, the Development Director or other authorized officer of the City shall prepare and submit to the Director of Development Services of the State of Ohio the status report required under Section 5709.40(I) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- SECTION 9. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in



# EXHIBIT B PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS

The Public Infrastructure Improvements include the construction of the following improvements on or near the Parcels that will directly benefit the Parcels and all related cost of permanent improvements (including, but not limited to, those costs listed in Section 133.15(B) of the Ohio Revised Code):

- Roadways. Construction, reconstruction, extension, opening, improving, widening, grading, draining, curbing or changing of the lines and traffic patterns of roads, highways, streets, intersections, bridges (both roadway and pedestrian), sidewalks, bikeways, medians and viaducts accessible to and serving the public, and providing lighting systems, signalization, and traffic controls, and all other appurtenances thereto.
- <u>Water/Sewer</u>. Construction, reconstruction or installation of public utility improvements (including any underground municipally owned utilities), storm and sanitary sewers (including necessary site grading therefore), water and fire protection systems, and all appurtenances thereto;
- <u>Utilities</u>. Construction, reconstruction or installation of gas, electric and communication service facilities and all appurtenances thereto;
- <u>Stormwater</u>. Construction, reconstruction and installation of stormwater and flood remediation projects and facilities, including such projects and facilities on private property when determined to be necessary for public health, safety and welfare;
- <u>Demolition</u>. Demolition, including demolition on private property when determined to be necessary for public health, safety and welfare;
- <u>Parks and Public Spaces</u>. Construction or reconstruction of one or more public parks, recreation facilities and meeting/gathering facilities, including grading, trees and other park plantings, building facilities, gazebos, off-street parking structures, accessories and related improvements, together with all appurtenances thereto;
- <u>Streetscape/Landscape</u>. Construction or installation of streetscape and landscape improvements including a clock tower, wayfinding and locational monuments, trees, tree grates, signage, curbs, sidewalks, street and sidewalk lighting, trash receptacles, benches, newspaper racks, burial of overhead utility lines and related improvements, together with all appurtenances thereto;
- Real Estate. Acquisition of real estate or interests in real estate (including easements) necessary to accomplish any of the foregoing improvements; and
- <u>Professional Services</u>. Engineering, consulting, legal, administrative, and other professional services associated with the planning, design, acquisition, construction and installation of the foregoing improvements and real estate.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 127-2024

DECLARING THE IMPROVEMENT TO CERTAIN PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY TO BE A PUBLIC PURPOSE AND EXEMPT FROM TAXATION AND PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND DEPOSIT OF SERVICE PAYMENTS INTO THE TAX INCREMENT EQUIVALENT FUND, AND SPECIFYING THE PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS DIRECTLY BENEFITING THE PARCELS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Sections 5709.40 to 5709.43 (collectively, the "TIF Statutes") authorize the legislative authority of a municipal corporation to declare the improvements to parcels of real property located within the municipal corporation to be a public purpose and exempt from taxation, specify public infrastructure improvements made, to be made or in the process of being made that directly benefit, require the owner of each parcel to make service payments in lieu of taxes, and establish a municipal public improvement tax increment equivalent fund for the deposit of the those service payments; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Sylvania has developed a plan for improving the infrastructure s and laying the basis for future growth and development by incurring debt for new public infrastructure in the area identified in Exhibit A; and,

WHEREAS, the parcels of real property identified and depicted in Exhibit A attached hereto (each such parcel individually, the "Parcel") are located in the City of Sylvania, Ohio (collectively, the "Property"), and this Council has determined to declare the Improvements to the Property to be a public purpose; and,

WHEREAS, this Council desires to provide for the public infrastructure improvements described in Exhibit B attached hereto (the "Public Infrastructure Improvements"); and,

WHEREAS, notice of this Ordinance has been delivered to the Sylvania City School District ("School District") pursuant to the requirements of Ohio Revised Code Sections 5709.40 and 5709.83, with the School District adopted a resolution waiving the notification period and approving the exemptions in excess of the statutory rate and term limits, as long as the school district receives Service Payments as directed in Section 4.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, County of Lucas, State of Ohio, \_\_\_\_\_ members thereto elected concurring that:

SECTION 1. Authorization of Tax Exemption. Pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 5709.40 of the Ohio Revised Code, this Council hereby finds and determines that one-hundred percent (100%) of the increase in assessed value of the parcels in the Property subsequent to the effective date of this Ordinance (which increase in assessed value is hereinafter referred to as the "Improvement," as defined in Section 5709.40(B) of the Ohio Revised Code) is hereby declared to be a public purpose and shall be exempt from taxation for a period commencing, for each Parcel comprising the Property, with the first tax year that begins after the effective date of this Ordinance and in which an Improvement attributable to a new structure first appears on the tax list and duplicate of real and public utility property for said Parcel, and ending on the earlier of (a) thirty (30) years after such commencement for said Parcel, or (b) the date on which the City can no longer require service payments in lieu of taxes for said Parcel, all in accordance with the requirements of the TIF Statutes. Pursuant to Section 5709.40(G) of the Ohio Revised Code, it is expressly the intent of this Ordinance that the exemptions of Improvements to Parcels authorized herein may commence in different tax years on a Parcel-by-Parcel basis, with a separate exemption term for each.

SECTION 2. Service Payments and Property Tax Rollback Payments. Pursuant to Section 5709.42 of the Ohio Revised Code, this Council hereby directs and requires the Owner(s) of the Property to make annual Service Payments (as defined herein) in lieu of taxes with respect to the Improvement allowable thereto to the Lucas County Treasurer on or before the final dates for payment of real property taxes. Each service payment in lieu of taxes, including any penalties and interest at the then-current rate established under Sections 323.121(B)(1) and 5703.47 of the Ohio Revised Code (collectively, the "Service Payments"), shall be charged and collected in the same manner and in the same amount as the real property taxes that would have been charged and payable against the Improvement if it were not exempt from taxation pursuant to Section 1 of this Ordinance. The Service Payments, and any other payments with respect to the Improvement that are received by the Lucas County Treasurer in connection with the reduction required by Sections 319.302, 321.24, 323.152, and 323.156 of the Ohio Revised Code, as the same may be amended from time to time, or any successor provisions thereto as the same may be amended from time to time (the "Property Tax Rollback Payments"), shall be allocated and distributed in

accordance with Section 4 of this Ordinance. This Council further hereby authorizes and directs appropriate officers of the City to make such arrangements as are necessary and proper for collection of the Service Payments from the Owners, including the preparation and filing of any necessary exemption applications.

SECTION 3. Tax Increment Equivalent Fund. This Council hereby establishes, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 5709.43 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Downtown Sylvania Public Improvement Tax Increment Equivalent Fund (the "TIF Fund"). The TIF Fund shall be maintained in the custody of the City and shall receive all distributions to be made to the City pursuant to Section 2 of this Ordinance. Those Service Payments and Property Tax Rollback Payments received by the City with respect to the Improvement of the Property and so deposited pursuant to Section 5709.42 of the Ohio Revised Code shall be used solely for the purposes authorized in the TIF Statutes or this Ordinance. The TIF Fund shall remain in existence so long as such Service Payments and Property Tax Rollback Payments are collected and used for the aforesaid purposes, after which time the TIF Fund shall be dissolved and any surplus funds remaining therein transferred to the City's General Fund, all in accordance with Section 5709.43 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. Distribution of Funds. Pursuant to the TIF Statutes, the Lucas County Treasurer is requested to distribute the Service Payments and the Property Tax Rollback Payments as follows:

- (i) To the School District: Twenty-Five percent (25%) of the Service Payments during years one through ten; and during years 11 through 30 an amount equal to the amounts the School District would otherwise have received as real property tax payments (including the applicable portion of any Property Tax Rollback Payments) derived from the Improvement to the Property located within the School District's boundaries if the Improvement had not been exempt from taxation pursuant to this Ordinance; and
- (ii) To the City: Seventy-Five percent (75%) of the Service Payments during years one through ten; and during years 11 through 30 all remaining amounts for further deposit in the TIF Fund for payment of costs of the Public Infrastructure Improvements, including debt service on any securities issued to finance those costs.
- (iii) As provided in subsection (i) and (ii) above, the exemptions of improvements to parcels authorized herein may commence in different tax years and the allocations to the school district and city shall be on a 75%/25% for years 1-10 of the exemption on a parcel-by-parcel basis, regardless of when the exemption term begins and with a separate exemption term for each. The allocations to the school district in years 11-30 of the exemption shall be an amount equal to the amounts the School District would otherwise have received as real property tax payments (including the applicable portion of any Property Tax Rollback Payments) derived from the Improvement to the Property located within the School District's boundaries if the Improvement had not been exempt from taxation pursuant to this ordinance and the allocation to the city for years 11-30 of the exemption shall be all remaining amounts for further

deposit in the TIF Fund for payment of costs of the Public Infrastructure Improvements, including debt service on any securities issued to finance those costs.

SECTION 5. Public Infrastructure Improvements. This Council hereby designates the Public Infrastructure Improvements described in Exhibit B attached hereto, and any other public infrastructure improvements hereafter designated by ordinance as public infrastructure improvements, as public infrastructure improvements made, to be made or constructed, or in the process of being made or constructed, by the City or other entity approved by the City that directly benefit, or that once made will benefit, the Property.

<u>SECTION 6. Non-Discriminatory Hiring Policy.</u> In accordance with Section 5709.832 of the Ohio Revised Code, this Council hereby determines that no employer located upon the Property shall deny any individual employment based solely on the basis of race, religion, sex, disability, color, national origin, or ancestry.

SECTION 7. Further Authorizations. This Council hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor, Economic Development Director, Finance Director, Law Director, and other appropriate officers of the City to make such arrangements as are necessary and proper for collection of the Service Payments. This Council further authorizes the Mayor, Development Director, Finance Director, Law Director, and other appropriate officers of the City to prepare and sign all agreements and instruments and to take any other actions as may be appropriate to implement this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. Filings with the Ohio Department of Development. Pursuant to Section 5709.40(I) of the Ohio Revised Code, the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to deliver a copy of this Ordinance to the Director of Development Services for the State of Ohio within fifteen (15) days after its adoption. Further, on or before March 31 of each year that the exemption set forth in Section 1 of this Ordinance remains in effect, the Development Director or other authorized officer of the City shall prepare and submit to the Director of Development Services of the State of Ohio the status report required under Section 5709.40(I) of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 9. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 10. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 11. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that the improvements in the district and the payments therefore should be approved immediately so that the improvements can be made at the earliest possible time. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.
