Re: Bid Award - Silica Drive/Summit Street/Erie Street Resurfacing Project

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

The Service Department requested City Council authorization to advertise for bids for the Silica Drive/Summit Street/Erie Street Resurfacing project at the December 16, 2024 meeting. The scope of work includes the resurfacing of Silica Drive from 1,250 feet north of Convent Boulevard to the bridge over Tenmile Creek, Summit Street, and Erie Street between Main Street and Summit Street. The resurfacing work will consist of a two-course milling and replacement including all necessary pavement repairs below the milled surface. The published engineer's estimate was \$629,075.

The City received six (6) bids on January 23, 2025. The apparent low bidder was Henry W. Bergman, Inc. from Genoa, Ohio with a bid of \$511,417 (18.7% under estimate). The 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest bid received was from Helms and Sons Excavating with a bid of \$546,950 (13.1% under estimate).

Henry W. Bergman, Inc. has successfully performed asphalt pavement resurfacing work for the City before including the north/south section of Silica Drive north of Convent Boulevard in 2019 and McCord Road between Sylvania Avenue and Brint Road in 2024.

This project was included in our 2025 budget and would be funded from account 401-7610-51616. As a reminder, the City will be receiving \$100,628 from an Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) grant and an additional \$100,628 will be funded from an Ohio Public Works Commission loan to be paid over a 10-year period at 0% interest. Therefore, it is our recommendation that the contract be awarded to Henry W. Bergman, Inc. in the amount of \$511,417.

WHEREAS, plans for the Silica Drive/Summit Street/Erie Street Resurfacing Project have been completed and are now on file with the Clerk of this Council; and,

WHEREAS, the Clerk of Council was authorized to advertise for bids at the December 16, 2024 meeting of Sylvania City Council and thereafter the Clerk advertised for bids, and the bids were opened on January 23, 2025, and thereafter, the Director of Public Service, by report dated February 3, 2025, stated that the engineer's estimate for the Silica Drive/Summit Street/Erie Street Resurfacing Project was \$629,075 and the following bids were received:

WHEREAS, the six (6) bids offered by the above bidders meet all of the City's specifications and the Director of Public Service, by report dated February 3, 2025, has recommended acceptance of the lowest and best bid of Henry W. Bergman, Inc. and that the contract for the Silica Drive/Summit Street/Erie Street Resurfacing Project be awarded to same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, \_\_\_\_\_ members elected thereto concurring:

- SECTION 1. That the bid of Henry W. Bergman, Inc., Genoa, Ohio for said Silica Drive/Summit Street/Erie Street Resurfacing Project, in the amount of Five Hundred Eleven Thousand Four Hundred Seventeen Dollars (\$511,417.00), is hereby determined to be the lowest and best bid received and the same is hereby accepted.
- SECTION 2. That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and hereby are, authorized and directed to execute a contract with the bidder named in Section 1 above for the furnishing of such labor and materials in accordance with said bid.
- SECTION 3. That to provide funds for said improvements hereby authorized, there is hereby appropriated from the **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND** from funds therein not heretofore appropriated to **Account No. 401-7610-51616 Silica Dr., Summit St., Erie St. Resurfacing**, the total sum of Five Hundred Eleven Thousand Four Hundred Seventeen Dollars (\$511,417.00).
- SECTION 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

2025 Chevrolet Silverado 2500 HD 4WD Truck & 2025 Chevrolet Silverado 3500 HD 4WD Truck

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

The Parks & Forestry Department has requested two vehicle replacements in their existing fleet.

One existing vehicle is a 2005 Chevy Silverado with 93,000 miles. This is a general use work truck that has served the Department well for 20 years and would be moved to GovDeals for auction when the new vehicle is ready for fleet service. The replacement truck is a 2025 Chevrolet Silverado 2500 HD 4WD Truck from Dave White Chevrolet at a purchase price of \$51,385. This truck is scheduled to have a liftgate package installed from Kalida Truck Equipment, Inc. for \$6,900 making the entire purchase price \$58,285.

The second existing vehicle is a 2002 Chevy Silverado 3500 dump truck with 70,000 miles. This 23-year-old vehicle is one of our heavy-duty trucks in the fleet and used year around in all seasons. This truck would be moved to GovDeals for auction when the new vehicle is ready for fleet service. The replacement truck is a 2025 Chevrolet Silverado 3500 HD Chassis work truck from Dave White Chevrolet at a purchase price of \$45,428. This truck is scheduled to have two packages added including a dump package with a light bar and modified drop sides to the body from Kalida Truck Equipment, Inc. for \$34,600 making the entire purchase price \$80,028.

The purchase of both vehicles was programmed into the 2025 budget and would be funded from the 401-7310-53405 account. We recommend the purchase of both vehicles. Please call with any questions.

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service, by report dated February 3, 2025, recommended the acceptance of the proposal of Dave White Chevrolet to purchase a new 2025 Chevrolet Silverado 3500 HD Chassis to be used as a dump truck for the Division of Parks and Forestry, Department of Public Service.

Re: Police Department Equipment Purchase – Taser Replacements

Dear Mr. Mayor and Council Members:

The Police Department has requested an equipment purchase to replace our existing tasers.

Existing tasers were purchased in 2016 from Axon (x26 models). The Department has twenty-six (26) tasers currently in service and one (1) out of service. The manufacturer's life expectancy for the tasers is five (5) years at which time they can no longer be serviced or additional models purchased.

The new tasers would be from the same manufacturer (Axon) and would be the Taser 10 model. The Department is requesting thirty-five (35) units be purchased which is enough for every sworn in officer to have their own unit. Also included in the purchase is training for five (5) instructors, five (5) years of training cartridges, and a 5-year warranty on all units. The cost proposal from Axon is in the amount of \$160,980.

The equipment purchase was programmed into the 2025 budget and would be funded from the 401-7110-53405 account.

We recommend the purchase of these taser replacements. Please call with any questions.

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Safety and Chief of Police have recommended that the Sylvania Police Department's Axon tasers be replaced; and,

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has received a proposal from Axon Enterprise, Inc., for thirty-five (35) new tasers; and,

WHEREAS, the existing tasers were purchased in 2016 and are no longer able to be serviced or any additional models purchased; and,

WHEREAS, the proposal is for thirty-five Taser 10 units and includes training for five instructors, five years of training cartridges and a 5-year warranty on all units.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, \_\_\_\_\_ members elected thereto concurring:

That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they hereby are, authorized to accept the proposal of Axon Enterprise, Inc. for the purchase of new Taser 10s for the City of Sylvania Police Department and the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and hereby are, authorized and directed to sign any and all instruments and to do any and all things necessary to complete said purchase.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> That to provide funds for said tasers hereby authorized, there is hereby appropriated from the **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND** from funds therein not heretofore appropriated to **Account No. 401-7110-53405** – **Equipment** the amount of One Hundred Sixty Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$160,980.00).

SECTION 3. WHEREAS, the request of the Sylvania Police Command Officer's Association was approved on or about January 9, 1997 to certify the request of the Sylvania Police Command Officer's Association to be the exclusive collective bargaining representative for all of the regular full-time police sergeants; and,

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF SYLVANIA BETWEEN THE CITY OF SYLVANIA AND THE BOARD OF LUCAS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE SUBURBAN COURT SERVICES PROGRAM; AGREEING TO PARTICIPATE IN FUNDING A PORTION OF THE LOCAL SHARE FOR SUBURBAN COURTS' SERVICES; APPROPRIATING \$25,000 THEREFORE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 169-97 approved the application by the Suburban Court Services to the Victims of Crime Assistance (hereinafter "VOCA") grant and authorized the City of Sylvania to share one-third of the 25% match required by the grant; and,

WHEREAS, said Ordinance authorized the expenditure of up to \$12,622.00 for Sylvania's local share of this grant; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 56-99, passed May 17, 1999, approved the Suburban Court Services grant application for federal funds under the Victims of Crime Act ("VOCA") through the office of the Ohio Attorney General's Office and agreed to participate in funding a portion of the local share up to \$15,056.34 for Sylvania's share of this grant; and,

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 17-2001, passed February 20, 2001, the City of Sylvania agreed to participate in a portion of the local share funding of Suburban Court Services which portion of funding increased to \$36,568.14 for the year 2001 due to the expiration of funding through the Byrne Memorial Grant and also included a three percent per year increase over the duration of the Agreement through September 30, 2003; and,

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 25-2004, passed March 15, 2004, the City of Sylvania agreed to participate in a portion of the local share funding of Suburban Court Services from October 1, 2003 through September 30, 2004 in the amount of \$38,795.14; and,

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 94-2004, passed November 15, 2004, the City of Sylvania

agreed to participate in a portion of the local share funding of Suburban Court Services from October 1, 2004 through September 30, 2005 in the amount of \$38,795.14; and,

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 97-2006, passed October 2, 2006, the City of Sylvania agreed to participate in a portion of the local share funding of Suburban Court Services from October 1, 2006 through September 30, 2007 in the amount of \$9,635.00, which price decrease was a result of the City now providing office space and supplies; and,

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 33-2008, passed April 7, 2008, the City of Sylvania agreed to participate in a portion of the local share funding of Suburban Court Services from October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2008 in the amount of \$25,000; and,

WHEREAS, since 2008, the City of Sylvania has participated in a portion of the local share funding of Suburban Court Services in the amount of \$25,000; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Sylvania has received a request for funding Suburban Court Services in the amount of \$25,000.00 for October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio, members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That City of Sylvania hereby agrees to participate in funding a portion of the local share in an amount of not to exceed Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for the year October 1, 2024 – September 30, 2025.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor and Director of Finance be, and they hereby are, authorized to evidence such approval and agreement by signing such documents as may be necessary and the Clerk of this Council is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance and provide such certified copy to Judge Bonfiglio.

SECTION 3. That to provide funds for said services hereby authorized, there is hereby appropriated from the GENERAL FUND from funds therein not heretofore appropriated to Account

**No. 110-7740-51295 - LCCPC Board Services** the total sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00).

SECTION 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this

Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to post a copy of this Ordinance in the Office of the Clerk of Council in the Municipal Building pursuant to ARTICLE III, Section 12, of the Charter of this City.

SECTION 6. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, property and welfare and for the further reason that funding for Suburban Court Services should be provided for immediately. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of five (5) or more members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after it is approved by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by the Charter.
